



REFACE.

- 12. John Graham, Lord Kilpont, was slain in August, 1644, during his father's lifetime. He married Lady Mary Keith, daughter of William Keith, Earl Marischal, in April, 1632. They had a son, William Graham, who became 8th Earl of Monteith and 2nd Earl of Airth about February 1670. He married twice but left no issue, and died in September, 1694. Lord Kilpont also had two daughters—Lady Mary Graham, of whom presently, and Lady Elizabeth Graham who married, in December, 1663, Sir William Graham of Gartmore.

APPENDIX.

The Allardyce claim on the Earldoms of Airth and Strathern is traced through Lady Mary Graham (No. 13) and her húsband, Sir John Allardyce (No. 13), in the pedigree, showing the Royal descent, and in the Allardyce pedigree down to James Allardyce, No. 28. The ancestry of the present claimant to the Earldom is traced here from James Allardyce, No. 28.

28. James Allardyce, or Allardice, only son of James Allardyce, No. 20, was born January 29, 1727 and was baptized on Jan. 30. He (then a minor) succeeded his father in 1728. He had a charter of the lands and barony of Allardyce July 27, 1748, He died July 14, 1765, and was buried, July 18, in the choir of the church at Arbuthnot. He married, in April 1756, Ann, daughter of James Barclay, of London, banker, who was interred July 18, 1757. His daughter—

52. Sarah Anne Allardice, of Allardyce, his sole heir, married in 1776, Robert Barclay of Ury or Urie who assumed the name Allardice on February 26, 1785. Their son—

53. Robert Barclay-Allardice married Mary Dalgarno by whom

54. Margaret Barclay-Allardice, who married at Kington, Middlesex, April 2, 1840, Samuel Ritchie. They had a son-

55. Robert Barclay-Allardice (the name assumed as heir to the Allardice estate) who was born at Hamilton in upper Canada, May 19, 1841. Baptized in the Presbyterian church there June 6, 1841.

Note from a letter written by William Marshall, Richmond, Virginia, November 1, 1911:

"There was a W. H. Allardyce of Philadelphia, living in 1869-70, who had a son Winslow Allardyce, a cadet at West Point. This W. H. Alladyce visited in Richmond, Virginia, in 1869-70, and then returned to Philadelphia. He was a friend of Samuel Freedley and also of the Jacoby family of Philadelphia. He returned to Philadelphia from Richmond in 1871."

Peter Allardyce was a resident of Philadelphia, mentioned in "The Picture of Philadelphia" by James Mease, 1811.

The OVER-SEAS EDITION of the DAILY MAIL, dated LONDON, DECEMBER 22, 1906, contained the following slightly incorrect information:—

ROMANCE OF THE PEERAGE.

DORMANT EARLDOM CLAIMED BY A STOCKBRUKER.

Two romantic claims to dormant earldoms are shortly to be heard before the House of Lords. The claimants are Alderman Barclay-Allardice, Mayor of Lostwithiel, and George Marshail Graham, of Leichtown. They both claim the earldom of Airthand Mr. Graham also claims the ancient and dormant earldoms of Menteith and Strathearn.

Mr. Barclay-Allardice was born in Hamilton. Ontario. and came to Cornwall after making a fortune as a stockbroker in Wall Street, New York. He claims to be descended in a direct line from the earl of Strathern, the eldest legitimate son of Robert II. of Scotland.

Mr. Graham, the claimant of the three earldoms, was born in Edinburgh, but went to Canada at an early age, and still owns property in the Dominion. Mr. Graham is a second cousin of the present Duke of Richmond.

James Allardyce, a Scotchman, died in New York City, February 20, 1918, on the day of the receipt of the compiler's letter concerning his family.

The PHILADELPHIA EVENING BULLETIN, October 21, 1910, contained a long article on His Magesty's Governor of the Falkland Islands, the heading of which was as follows.—

A trilopite discovered by Governor Allardyce in the Falkland Islands was named Diaphosastonia allardycea.
